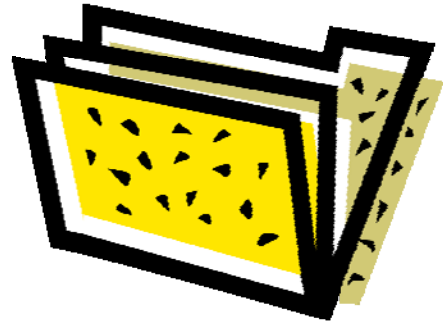

Wednesday Folders

Let me introduce you to our Wednesday folder!! These will be coming home each week packed full with wonderful information, exciting work your student has completed, Blue Creek's weekly newsletter, etc. Please expect these every Wednesday and take a moment to look through them.

The front of the folder needs to be signed and the folder returned to school on Thursday. Please encourage your student to be responsible in having these folders signed as it is building citizenship and responsibility.

At the top of the front page is your student's stated goals for AR (points needed by the end of the trimester) and AM (objectives to earn by the end of the trimester). Near the signature section you will see three percentages. One of the percentages pertains to where we are in the trimester; the other two percentages show where your student falls within their goals. R E S P O N S I B I L I T Y

Responsibility in a classroom is more than whether or not your student has behaved positively or negatively in the classroom. Other factors are taken into consideration as well. In sixth grade behavior will be considered a gradable area. The components that will make up the behavior grade will be responsibility, attitude, and homework. This is worth SIX POINTS a day. Ways a child may earn ALL six points is by:

- Signatures on Daily Assignment Notebooks and Wednesday Folders.**
- Completed reading and math assignments on their designated homework nights. Please DO NOT sign if your student has not completed the homework assigned for the night.**
- Following the Code of Conduct policy.**

Failure to earn all points may be that the student refuses to complete any of the above factors taken into consideration. Absences are also taken into consideration; however, your student may earn these points by completing an alternative assignment.

Responsibility and a positive attitude will assure an outstanding grade for behavior.
